Tuesday, 9th May 2017


How was South Africa going to deal with its violent and oppressive past? The TRC wanted to ensure accountability, which was a prerequisite for a human rights culture in our new democracy.

**Section 1 :** Siphiwo Mthimkhulu: An example of a case that appeared before the Human Rights Violation Committee and then went to the Amnesty Committee, where the murder was eventually solved.  
**Section 2 :** The Breast Feeding Warrior Phila Ndwandwe left South Africa illegally to join Umkhonto we Sizwe after she left school and did her basic military training in Angola in 1985.
